
society have not yet been pieced back together. Echoes of a long settled conflict remind us that maybe these states are not as 'united' as the name once implied."



Hampton Arts Education is committed to providing inspiring performing and visual art classes, camps, workshops and cultural events that allow each participant to own a part of the creative process. While our visual and fine arts education program, ArtWorks, took a hiatus for a short time, we are still planning the best ways to work with regional school districts! Our program goal is to augment the schools' visual arts curriculums with our Teaching Artists to support our region's art teachers.

Finally, we're already thinking and looking ahead to our SummerStage Musical Theatre Institute in 2023. We anticipate offering a host of world-class theatre experiences through a combination of arts-intensive workshops and classes with professional actors and instructors from around the world and around the corner.

Our mission at Hampton Arts Education is always to provide our citizens and audiences with exciting, diverse and dynamic outlets for artistic expression. Our creativity will have no limits – and neither will our commitment to arts education! We will continue to passionately enable you to do more, try more, and be more!

HAMPTON FE D U C A T I O N

THE AMERICAN THEATRE

Over 100 years ago, long before the Town of Phoebus was incorporated into the City of Hampton, construction began on a theatre, which was to provide "clean, wholesome amusement." The American Theatre opened in 1908 and subsequently survived many incarnations and even a fire.

The American Theatre enjoyed a century of growth and change, but it has always remained the centerpiece of the historic community. The American is the only remaining theatre of the four that Hampton supported during the first half of the 20th century. Generations fondly recall the 10¢ movies on Saturdays. The American became The Lee for a while, and it became the Lee Adult during the years when Phoebus itself was enjoying its reputation as "Little Chicago." During the 1980s the theatre became The New American Theatre where beer and pizza accompanied a movie and local bands played.

In the mid–1990s the Hampton Arts Foundation, in an exciting public/private partnership with the City of Hampton, purchased the building, fulfilling a long-standing dream of arts patrons throughout the region to create a boutique, intimate and acoustically superior space for the performing arts. Since its opening in 2000, the City of Hampton has provided day-to-day operations for The American Theatre, leasing the building from the Hampton Arts Foundation.

The American Theatre now hosts more than 50 attractions a year. The Arts in Education programs have flourished, featuring classes, workshops, and camps for all ages. Whether presenting artists from around the world, or around the corner — The American Theatre, a Hampton Arts venue, stands as a beacon to improve the quality of life for citizens throughout Coastal Virginia!
