

The Virginia Glass Guild presents this juried exhibition featuring the many forms of glass created by members of the guild of artists working across the state of Virginia. The exhibition offers a wide range of creative glass processes, including blown, carved, cast, painted, flame-worked, fused, leaded, neon, sandblasted and stained glass. This year's juror is Chelsea Pierce, Ph.D. who is the McKinnon Modern and Contemporary Art Curator at the Chrysler Museum of Art.

Artists Who Teach is an annual juried exhibition that presents the artwork of our talented visual arts educators throughout Coastal Virginia.

Artwork in all media will be presented by current educators of local schools, colleges, art centers and institutions. This year's exhibition will be juried by Betsy DiJulio, full-time National Board Certified Art Teacher, teacher at Norfolk Academy, and freelance arts writer. This year's exhibition features cash prizes awarded to First Place (\$750), Second Place (\$500), and Third Place (\$250).

GROWTH IN LIMINAL SPACE Solo Exhibition by Jenn Clemons

"This past fall I visited the rainforests and beaches of the Pacific Northwest. Deep in the moss draped depths of the Hoh Rainforest some of the oldest and largest trees tower above their

and largest trees tower above their surroundings or have fallen buried within the ferns of the forest floor with new growth rising up from their trunks. With the dramatic climate changes that we now face, what is the future of these centuries-old giants? Will these gnarled towers still be living in another hundred years or will the driftwood monuments be all that remain? Their existence is at the edge of a precipice. To capture this idea, I gravitate to working from unusual tree forms that reflect their movement. I remove the background and focus on the form of the tree existing in the state of limbo. Working on large sheets of plywood in graphite with oil paint and pastels, I create texture and movement through loose marking and the layering of materials. In these shapes, I let the forms come to life of their own accord to reach out and share their story, engaging in a dialogue with the viewer."

This widely observed holiday focuses on remembering family members and friends who have passed away. This originates from the ancient indigenous peoples of Mexico who believed that the souls of the dead return each year to visit with their living relatives - to eat, drink and be merry. Just like they did when they were living.

This free family-friendly event includes a traditional colored straw demonstration by Cesar Carbajal as well as the preparation of an altar where members of the community can share a prayer, light a candle or bring a memento to place as an offering for loved ones. Activities include face painting, costume contest, sidewalk chalk drawing, and exploring the VMFA On the Road Artmobile. Craft stations include making paper marigolds, Day of the Dead masks, skull magnets and creating papel picado. Food trucks will be onsite.







Artists working in painting and drawing can sign up to use studio space when classes are not being held. Independent, individuals working only; no materials or instruction are provided.

During open hours, arts organizations can hold meetings in our upstairs classroom. Up to 25 people. \$40 per hour. Chairs and tables provided.





Over 100 years ago, long before the Town of Phoebus was incorporated into the City of Hampton, construction began on a theatre, which was to provide "clean, wholesome amusement." The American Theatre opened in 1908 and subsequently survived many incarnations and even a fire.

The American Theatre enjoyed a century of growth and change, but it has always remained the centerpiece of the historic community. The American is the only remaining theatre of the four that Hampton supported during the first half of the 20th century. Generations fondly recall the 10¢ movies on Saturdays. The American became The Lee for a while, and it became the Lee Adult during the years when Phoebus itself was enjoying its reputation as "Little Chicago." During the 1980s, the theatre became The New American Theatre where beer and pizza accompanied a movie and local bands played.

In the mid–1990s the Hampton Arts Foundation in an exciting public/private partnership with the City of Hampton, purchased the building, fulfilling a long-standing dream of arts patrons throughout the region to create a boutique, intimate and acoustically superior space for the performing arts. Since its opening in 2000, the City of Hampton has provided day-to-day operations for The American Theatre, leasing the building from the Hampton Arts Foundation.

The American Theatre now hosts more than 50 performances a year. The Arts in Education programs have flourished, featuring classes, workshops, and camps for all ages. Whether presenting artists from around the world or around the corner, The American Theatre, a Hampton Arts venue, stands as a beacon to improve the quality of life for citizens throughout Coastal Virginia!

The Hampton Arts Education season is back and better than ever for 2023-2024! We will be offering a robust season of arts education events.

Our pre-and post-show talkbacks, On TAP at the American, will return for selected performances. Starting in the fall, we will be launching a series of performing arts classes and workshops for learners of all ages.

Our Spring Fling Visual Arts Camp for young budding artists will return to provide an immersive and creative experience for young artists in many visual arts disciplines.

Our partnership with the Armed Services Arts Partnership (ASAP) will expand to offer more free visual and performing arts classes and workshops for members of the military community.

In June, our Summer Performing and Visual Arts Camps will also be returning with even more innovative day camps for young artists to unleash their creativity.

Whether you're a seasoned artist looking to refine your craft or a beginner just starting out, we have something for you. Join us for a season full of community, passion, and creativity!
