



NOBUNTU

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7, 2023 AT 8PM

Zimbabwean female acapella group Nobuntu, an African concept meaning humbleness, love, unity, and family from a woman's point of view, has drawn international acclaim for its inventive performances ranging from traditional Zimbabwean songs to Afro Jazz to Gospel. Performances consist of pure voices, minimalistic percussion, and traditional instruments such as Mbira and authentic dance movements.

The group has performed all around the world and been nominated for Best Musician of the Year at the Zimbabwe International Women Awards in 2015. They are also a two-time winner of Best Imbube Group at the Bulawayo Arts Awards in 2017 and 2019.

Representing a new generation of young African women wanting to sing, celebrate, and preserve their culture through art, Nobuntu believes that music can be an important drive for change. This world-renowned acapella group will inspire you to challenge what is normal while sharing the beauty in their African culture.

LORRIE MORGAN

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2023 AT 8PM

Noted as one of the most eloquently emotive vocalists of modern times, Lorrie Morgan was the first woman in her genre to begin her career with three consecutive Platinum albums. A Nashville native, Morgan is the daughter of Country Music Hall of Fame Member George Morgan. At 13, she made her debut on the Grand Ole Opry stage, and at 24, she was inducted into the Grand Ole Opry. Her first three albums, Leave the Light On (1989), Something in Red (1991) and Watch Me (1992), all earned Platinum Record awards and her Greatest Hits collection (1999) is also platinum. In 2013, Lorrie teamed up with fellow Opry singer Pam Tillis to make a CD titled Dos Divas. The singers then went on a sold-out tour that lasted about 2 years and the ladies still perform their collaborative Grits & Glamour shows.

Whether covering a classic or sharing one of her own songs, Morgan is truly a song stylist in the grandest tradition. Experience a piece of Grand Ole Opry history as Lorrie Morgan showcases her incredible range of vocal and performance abilities.

Varla Jean Merman (aka Jeffery Roberson) is guaranteed to steal the show no matter where she is. As an international singer, actress, and chanteuse, she has filled cabarets and concert halls around the world including, Sydney Opera House, Carnegie Hall, and London's Solo Theatre. In 2011, Varla starred in the musical, Lucky Guy, with the legendary late Leslie Jordan in New York at the Little Schubert. Varla has left her mark all over television and Broadway, having appeared in productions such as Ugly Betty, Project Runway, Chicago, and All My Children. Along with co-stars Miss Coco Peru and Evie Harris, Merman shared the Best Actor Grand Jury Award at Outfest 2003 and "Best Actress" honors at both the 2003 U.S. Comedy Arts Festival and the 2003 Aspen HBO Film Festival for her role in "Girls Will Be Girls."

PINK MARTINI FEATURING CHINA FORBES

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 28, 2023 AT 8PM

Featuring a dozen musicians, with songs in 25 languages, Pink Martini performs its multilingual repertoire on concert stages on six continents. After making it's European debut at the Cannes Film Festival in 1997 and its orchestral debut with the Oregon Symphony in 1998, the band has gone on to play with more than50 orchestras around the world, including multiple engagements with the Los Angeles Philharmonic at the Hollywood Bowl, the Boston Pops, the National Symphony at the Kennedy Center, the San Francisco Symphony, the Cleveland Orchestra, and the BBC Concert Orchestra at Royal Albert Hall in London. In 2014, Pink Martini was inducted into both the Hollywood Bowl Hall of Fame and the Oregon Music Hall of Fame.

Pink Martini has released 11 studio albums on its own independent label Heinz Records (named after bandleader Thomas Lauderdale's dog), selling over 3 million albums worldwide. In 2019, the band released two EPs featuring the vocals of Pink Martini's newest members Jimmie Herrod and Edna Vazquez. Both vocalists have toured with the band for the past year and are officially part of the group with the release of Herrod's EP Tomorrow and Vaquez's Besame Mucho, both of which were co-produced by Thomas Lauderdale and China Forbes.





ARRIVAL FROM SWEDEN: THE MUSIC OF ABBA



SQUIRREL NUT ZIPPERS CHRISTMAS CARAVAN

The Squirrel Nut Zippers are an American swing band that formed in Chapel Hill, North Carolina in 1993. Their music style is a mix of Delta blues, gypsy jazz, 1930s swing, klezmer, and other styles. The term "Nut Zippers" is a southern term for a variety of old bootleg moonshine and the band's name comes from a newspaper story about an intoxicated man who climbed a tree and refused to come down even after police arrived. The headline was "Squirrel Nut Zipper."

They found success during the swing revival of the late 1990s with their 1996 single hit, "Hell", written by vocalist and guitarist Tom Maxwell. Their second album, Hot (1996), was certified platinum and was also one of the first enhanced CDs, containing an interactive presentation created by filmmaker Clay Walker. The band has toured with singer Neil Young, performed at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta, and at President Clinton's second inaugural ball. This holiday season, take a musical trip back in time and find out what the Squirrel Nut Zippers are all about!







The handsome building on the corner of Victoria Boulevard and Kecoughtan Road in downtown Hampton has been a vibrant center of learning, exploration and creativity for more than eight decades thanks to the farsighted vision of Mrs. Grace Taylor Armstrong. It was in 1925 that Mrs. Armstrong, married to a decorated soldier, Captain Matthew Armstrong, made the decision to create a living memorial to her father, General Charles H. Taylor (who was the Founder and Managing Editor of The Boston Globe).


Mrs. Armstrong conveyed in trust the land and building to be known as "The Charles H. Taylor Memorial Library — for the use and benefits of the residents of Elizabeth City County, including the City of Hampton and the incorporated Towns and communities within said County." The Armstrong family was also very instrumental

in the establishment and growth of Hampton University - then known as Hampton Institute.

After time spent as the Hampton Public Library, today The Charles H. Taylor Visual Arts Center is lauded as a comprehensive arts center, which showcases the work of visual artists from throughout Coastal Virginia, the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Mid-Atlantic region. It is a showcase for up-and-coming artists and their teachers in all media, the home of prestigious juried exhibitions, an ever-evolving studio program, and a host to an ongoing series of workshops, demonstrations and seminars.

We are dedicated to sharing artists from around the world and around the corner — and we have no plans of slowing down!




